<b>Focus</b>	To promote our values of Respect, Enthusiasm, Friendliness and Cooperation within the student body and to develop confidence and encourage leadership skills, by taking action and applying Civics and Citizenship understandings.
<b>Junior School Council</b>	<p>Junior School Council is formed by student elected members from each grade 1-6 to represent the school student body and to allow opportunity for input into relevant issues and decisions that will lead to improvement.</p> <p>This includes social service events, School Improvement planning and project teams (i.e. playground), School Council meetings, community services and student feedback on school programs.</p>
<b>Team Captains</b>	Team Captains are selected from the year five cohort at the end of each year by self nomination, and elected by a vote of students in years 3-5 after presenting to their peers reasons as to why they would be a good team captain. Throughout the year they represent their team, and are responsible for organising and running assemblies and team meetings.
<b>Specialist Leaders</b>	At the end of each year students in year five will have the opportunity to apply for a number of other leadership positions supporting specialist programs and areas of interest across the school. These roles will enable students to build leadership skills and connect with an area of their passion.
<b>Student Responsibilities</b>	Students in year six will help take responsibility and ownership within the school by supporting with different roles. These will help to build skills including organisation and communication.
