Bushfire preparedness is not just a concern for schools listed on the Bushfire At-Ri Register (BARR). While we not on the BARR, Berwick Fields will ensure it is bushfil and that all appropriate measures are met within the school to ensure student safet and in the event of a bushfire emergency in Victoria. Consideration is also given to transport to and from school, participation in offsite activities (including camps, excuand sporting activities) and the risk of localised fire events. Managing Offsite Events For all camps and excursions in Terms 1 and 4, the Principal class will make a judg about the safe travel of students to and from these locations, in consultation with information from the CFA. In the event of a CODE RED day being declared in a region, any excursion or campare a will be cancelled. If a CODE RED is declared while students are on camp, the will arrange to return students to school, or move to the closest emergency refuge particles to possible opportunity.
