





A GUIDE FOR PARENTS OF PRIMARY AGED CHILDREN HELPING YOUR CHILDREN WITH MATHEMATICS

SOME SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES

The following are some activities that you can do with your children. Some are general and some relate to specific aspects of the mathematics curriculum.

LEARNING TO COUNT

Learning to count is important. Counting 1,2,3,4..... is the main way, but also counting using patterns:

2, 4, 6, 8..... 100, 99, 98, 97..... 0.5, 1, 1.5, 2.....

5, 10, 15, 20..... 100, 90, 80, 70..... a, b, c, d......

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday..... January, February, March.....

Nursery rhymes help with forwards and backwards counting. "Five little ducks", "1,2,3,4,5, once I caught a fish alive", "10 green bottles", are just a few examples of the nursery rhymes you can say together.

When walking around the block, predict the next house number and then check.

SHAPES

Children can learn about shape names by hearing them used in everyday speech. You can also:

- Use shape names to describe objects, such as the square table, or the rectangular vegetable garden
- Get them to sort the cutlery drawer
- Play 'I Spy' games when travelling or walking. I spy with my little eye something that is shaped like a hexagon
- Do jigsaw puzzles together and ask the child to imagine the piece they need for a particular spot
- Have them help tidy items in the toolshed
- Make buildings using different shaped blocks.

DOMINOES

Below are some ideas, that increase with difficulty, on how to utilise Dominoes at home connect to maths!

- Roll 2 dice & match the dominoes to the dice
- 2. Record the total on your dominoes. Try to group without counting by ones...
- 3. Find the equivalent for your dominoes:



= 5



4. Flip all your dominoes over so they are face down. Flip a domino each and highest wins/keeps them. Say your number out loud.



= 2 and 3 is 5



= 4 and 6 is 10. I win!

5. Flip all your dominoes over so they are face down. Flip a domino each and whoever has the lowest difference wins.



The difference between 2 & 3 is 1

The difference between 4 & 6 is 2

- 6. Domino detective...I've got a domino in my pocket! Ask me questions to guess the Kmart \$5 domino!
- 7. Domino sort: Sort your dominos into two groups with a secret rule. Browse others to see if you can work out their rule!

Respectful Relationship Program Semester 2



During semester 2 Berwick Field students will be focusing on topics 7 &8 – "Gender & Identity" and "Positive Gender Relations":

As part of our curriculum this semester, we will be focusing on important issues related to human rights and gender identity with the students. These topics are essential because they enable students to understand our diverse world and promote respect within relationships.

Learning activities within the "Gender and Identity" topic assist students to challenge stereotypes and critique the influence of gender norms on attitudes and behaviour. They will learn about key issues relating to human rights and gender identity and focus on the importance of respect within relationships.

When discussing human rights, students will explore concepts like equality, fairness, and dignity. This helps children learn about treating everyone with kindness and understanding, regardless of differences in background, ethnicity, or beliefs.

Most importantly when covering gender identity, teachers will approach it in a sensitive and ageappropriate manner. We aim to create a supportive environment where students can learn about different identities and expressions. This fosters respect and empathy among peers, which is crucial in creating inclusive communities.

"Positive Gender Relations" focuses on building an understanding of the effects of gender-based violence and focuses on the standards associated with respectful relationships. Students develop the skills needed to solve problems, set boundaries within relationships, and play an active role within the prevention of gender-based violence. They develop peer support and help-seeking skills that can be applied in response to situations involving gender-based violence in family, peer, community, or on-line relationships.
